



Local Rules – Specific to Moliets Golf

ABNORMAL COURSE CONDITIONS – Rule 16 GROUND UNDER REPAIR

- Bare areas on the greens
- Deep indentations of vehicle wheels
- Areas damaged by wild boars, marked or not, or recently repaired

NO PLAY ZONES

- Hole N°2: when the ball lies in the red penalty area on the left side of the hole, including behind the green, the player must take penalty relief according to Rule 17.1 e.
- In addition, on this hole, the fences and posts are declared an integral part of the course and do not give the right to any relief without penalty.
- Hole N°13: the area to the left of the fairway delimited by a dotted white line and blue stakes,
- Hole N°15: the area on the right of the fairway delimited by a dotted white line and blue stakes.
- For these holes N°13 and N°15, when there is interference (ball, stance or intentional swing area) the player must take relief without penalty according to Rule 16.1 f.

IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS

- Tarred and/or gravel paths
- Staked tree and/or basin at its foot
- White tarpaulins.
- When in a bunker and there are wooden sleepers around it, the area delimited by the ends of all these wooden sleepers is an abnormal condition of the course. The player must take relief without penalty according to Rule 16.1.

INTEGRAL OBJECTS

- Synthetic turf walls in bunkers
- Fences, gates and cattle grids

PREFERRED LIES

- When a player's ball lies in a part of the general area cut to fairway height or less, the player may take free relief once by placing the original ball (or another ball) and playing it from this relief area.
- Reference Point: The spot of the original ball

MOLIETS

- Size of relief area measured from the reference point: one score card length from the reference point, but with these limitations
- Restrictions on the relief area: must not be closer to the hole than the reference point, and must be in the general area
- If after being placed the ball moves under the effect of natural forces and lies in a cut or uncut part of the general area outside an abnormal course condition, it must be played from that new position and this local rule no longer applies.

Penalty for breach of a local rule: general penalty

RULES ISSUES IN STROKE PLAY – Rule 20.1 c (3)

If in doubt as to the correct procedure, the player may play two balls under Rule 20.1. Before returning the score card, the player must report the facts to the Committee under penalty of disqualification.
